What does Paul accuse his countrymen of doing in *Romans 2:20-24*?

How can we cultivate a constant presence that God examines our hearts (1 Thessalonians 2:4)?

How can we cultivate genuine humility and thus avoid hypocrisy?

What great evil resulted when Jews who knew God's laws failed to obey them?

Why should honoring God (*Romans 2:24*) be our number one priority? Practically, what is involved in this?



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
