## **Principles on Disagreeing**

- 1. Accept those who disagree with you (*Romans 14:1-2*)
- 2. If you have freedom of conscience don't look down on those who don't (*Romans 14:3-4*)
- 3. If your conscience restricts you, don't be judgmental toward those who have freedom (*Romans 14:3-4*)
- 4. Be fully convinced of your position in your own conscience (*Romans 14:5*)
- 5. Assume others are partaking or abstaining for the glory of God (*Romans 14:6-9*)
- 6. Don't judge others in these things because we will all stand before God's judgment seat (*Romans 14:10-12*)
- 7. Don't let your freedom cause others to stumble (*Romans 14:13-15*)
- 8. Disagreements about debatable things aren't important in the kingdom of God; building each other up in righteousness, peace, and joy is the important thing (*Romans 14:16-21*)
- 9. If you have freedom, don't flaunt it; if you're conscience restricts you, don't expect others to do the same (*Romans 14:22*)
- 10. Live according to your conscience and be blessed (*Romans* 14:22-23)
- 11. Follow Christ's example and put others first (Romans 15:1-3)
- 12. Bring glory to God by accepting others as Christ has accepted you (*Romans 15:5-7*)

## **Questions to Ask When Deciding on Debatable Issues**

- 1. Does it violate Scripture? (John 14:15; 1 John 2:3)
- 2. Does it violate the laws or rules of those in authority over me? (Romans 13:1; Ephesians 6:1)
- 3. Does it do harm to my mind or body? (1 Corinthians 6:19-20)
- 4. Does it control me and/or my actions? (1 Corinthians 6:12)
- 5. Is it motivated by something other than God's love for others? (1 Corinthians 10:24)
- 6. Does it go against my conscience? (*Romans 14:5; 1 Corinthians 8:7; 1 John 3:19-21*)
- 7. Does it glorify someone other than God? (1 Corinthians 6:20; 10:31)
- 8. Will this be a hindrance to non-Christians around me? Does it hurt my witness to them? (*Matthew 5:16; 1 Corinthians 10:32-33; Colossians 4:5*)
- 9. Will it offend or cause other Christians to stumble and sin? (Romans 14:21-23; 1 Corinthians 8:9; 10:23-32)
- 10. Will this hinder my own spiritual growth? (Hebrews 12:1)
- 11. Is there a better use of my time and/or resources? (*Psalm 90:12; Ephesians 5:15-16*)
- 12. Could this be done in Christ's name? Can I imagine Jesus doing this? Would I want to be found doing this when Jesus returns? (Colossians 3:17; 1 John 2:6; 2:28)
