5. Does God still heal today?
6. Do people heal like Jesus today? Why or why not? Explain.
7. Why is the phrase, *and she waited on them* (*Mark 1:31*), important?
8. Why were people bringing the ill and demon-possessed to Jesus (*Mark 1:32*)?
9. What does it mean that *He healed many... and cast out many demons* (*Mark 1:34*)?
10. Why does Jesus, being God incarnate, need to pray?
11. Mark only includes three times when Jesus goes out to pray (*Mark 1:35*; *6:46*; *14:32-35*). Why do you think Mark picks these?
12. Why do *Simon and his companions* search for Jesus (*Mark 1:36-37*)?
13. Why does Jesus not go back to Capernaum and capitalize on His popularity there?
14. For what purpose did Jesus come according to *Mark 1:38*?
15. What did Jesus do *throughout all Galilee* (*Mark 1:39*)?
16. What do we learn from Jesus' prayers in the following verses?
